THIS WEEK

DR. JOHN BARKLEY, the first and current Medical Director of Charlotte Hospice, spoke with us today about the role Hospice plays during the final days of the terminally ill.

He explained that doctors are trained to try and fix whatever is wrong with a patient, but most often lack the skills to emotionally aid a dying patient...No qualifying family is turned down by Hospice regardless of ability to help defray the costs involved. Due to budget constrictions, hospice organizations bordering Mecklenburg County have necessarily set higher restrictions.

All patients under hospice care must be approved by their physicians, and must be diagnosed as having six or fewer months to live. According to *DR*. *BARKLEY*, 50% of patients entering the Charlotte program are dead within three weeks.

Hospice is reimbursed primarily by Medicare, which allows a per diem allowance for each patient under their care. Seven and a half doctors, nurses and bereavement counselors form the nucleus of the Charlotte hospice group
